Go Up to the Mountain, Bring the Wood, and Build the House- Haggai 1:8

The year 2026 stands before us as a blessed and hopeful year in the life of our Church. With prayerful hearts, we are trusting God for an own church facility—a place where generations can worship, pray, and grow in faith. Our motto for this year, “Be still, and know that I am God” (Psalm 46:10a), reminds us that while we plan and labor, it is the Lord who fights for us and establishes His purpose.

At the beginning of this month, we dedicated the new Executive Committee during the worship service. We thank God for calling them to serve, and we pray that He will bless them abundantly with wisdom, humility, courage, and a prayerful spirit. Leadership in God’s Church is not merely administrative; it is spiritual stewardship. As a congregation, let us continually uphold them in prayer, so that they may lead according to God’s plan and desire, not human preference.

The message of the prophet Haggai speaks powerfully into our present context. The book of Haggai belongs to the post-exilic period. The magnificent Temple built by Solomon was destroyed by the Babylonians. After nearly 70 years of exile, the people returned to Jerusalem. Though they came back in BC 536 and began rebuilding the Temple, opposition and discouragement caused the work to stop for about 16 years (Ezra 4:1-5). During this long pause, the people shifted their focus. Instead of rebuilding God’s house, they invested their energy and resources in building their own paneled houses (Haggai 1:4). Their priorities changed, and spiritual laziness crept in.

It was into this situation that God raised the prophet Haggai in BC 520. His ministry lasted only about four months—but it was a season of strong encouragement and divine correction. Haggai confronted the people with a crucial truth: misplaced priorities lead to spiritual and material barrenness. “You have sown much, and harvested little... you earn wages, only to put them in a bag with holes in it” (Haggai 1:5-6). When self-interest rises above God’s interest, life loses its fullness.

This is a word for us today. We, too, have sold our old church, are worshipping in a rented space, and are prayerfully preparing to purchase the very church where we now gather. Like the post-exilic community, we are trusting God for restoration and provision. Haggai reminds us that God must have first priority—not merely His blessings, but God Himself. As Jesus teaches in Matthew 6:33, when we seek first the Kingdom of God, everything else finds its rightful place. Family, work, education, recreations, Jim, tuition, sports, and daily needs are all good and necessary—but even good things can become harmful if they keep us from the best.

Haggai 1:8 gives us three powerful instructions for this season:

First: “Go up to the mountain.”

Mountains in Scripture are places of God’s presence. Abraham encountered God on Mount Moriah, Moses on Mount Sinai, and Jesus often withdrew to the mountains to pray. Before engaging in God’s work, we must seek God’s presence. Before we build, we must pray. Before action, there must be adoration. Prayer must always come before planning. As a Church, we are called to climb the mountain—setting aside time for prayer, fasting, and listening to God. Especially as we enter the 40 days of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 18, let this be a season of deeper spiritual focus and surrender.

Second: "Bring wood."

God invites His people to bring what they have. Wood represents what we bring to God from what He has already given us. It represents our resources, talents, time, and blessings. A child brought five loaves to Jesus; David brought five stones and a willing heart; Paul surrendered his knowledge and pen for the Gospel. God invites us to bring our gifts-not because He lacks, but because our obedience invites His glory. Everything we have comes from God, and He calls us to offer it back to Him willingly and joyfully.

Third: "Build the house."

When Zerubbabel, Joshua, and the people obeyed the word of the Lord, they rose up and rebuilt the Temple. God's work advances when God's people respond in faith. Today, as we prayerfully seek to purchase the church where we worship, we trust that obedience will open the way for divine intervention.

As we enter the season of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 18, it becomes even more meaningful. May this year be one where we set our priorities right, seek God first, and witness His miraculous provision. May the Lord stir our hearts, strengthen our committee members, unite our congregation, and guide us as we go up to the mountain, bring wood, and build His house-for His glory alone. Amen.

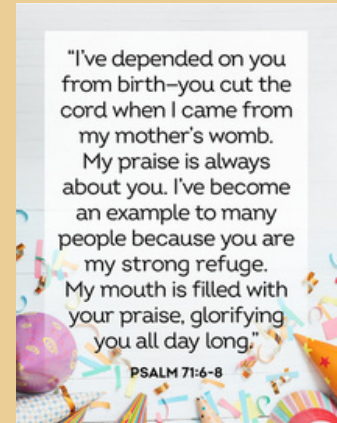
