

Creating Mentors and Leaders in the Church October Youth Focus

October is a month of change. The leaves turn colors, the air grows cooler, and we are reminded that every season has a purpose. In the same way, the church also goes through seasons- and one of the most important is raising up new leaders and mentors, especially among our youth.

The Bible is full of young leaders who made a difference for God's Kingdom. Joseph was a teenager when he was sold into slavery, but God used him to save nations. David was a shepherd boy when God chose him to be king. Samuel heard God's voice as a child. Esther, though young, was brave enough to save her people. Timothy, in the New Testament, became a church leader even when some thought he was too young. Mary, the mother of Jesus, gave her life to God's plan at young age. These stories remind us: God doesn't wait for us to grow older to use us. He is looking for faithful hearts right now.

But today, we face a challenge. Many young people in North America are drifting away from the presence of God. The very countries that once sent missionaries across the world are now forgetting the name of Jesus in their own homes. The culture is pulling our children in many directions- through social media, entertainment, and voices that deny God's truth. The national mottos and foundations of these lands were deeply rooted in Scripture, yet the current generation is increasingly influenced by secular ideologies, liberal trends, and voices that distort the truth. Leaders who stand boldly for Christ are often attacked by the powers of darkness, targeted by corrupt media, interest groups, and cultural forces that oppose the Gospel.

Still, there is hope. Revival can begin with one young person who says "Yes" to God. And God is working in surprising ways. Once, missionaries from America and Europe came to countries like India to share the Gospel. Today, those countries are sending faithful Christians back to the West to remind people of Jesus. As an Indian Christian community in North America, we have a special role. We can be witnesses in a land where faith is fading. Our lives, our families, and our churches can shine as examples of Christ's love.

But how can we do this? The key is mentorship. Paul had Timothy. Naomi guided Ruth. Jesus trained his disciples. Faith grows best when someone walks with you, encourages you, and teaches you. Our youth need mentors- parents, teachers, and church leaders-who will pray with them, listen to them, and challenge them to stand strong in faith.

Leadership in the church is not about having a title. It is about serving with humility and courage. Jesus said, "Whoever wants to be great must be your servant" (Mark 10:43). Our young people can lead by showing love, standing for truth, and living faithfully in their schools, colleges, and workplaces.

To the youth of our church: God is calling you. Like Daniel, you can stay faithful even in a culture that does not honor God. Like Jeremiah, you may feel too young, but God promises to put His words in your mouth. Like Esther, you are placed here "for such a time as this." Don't be afraid- rise up and be a witness for Jesus.

The future of the church depends on how we nurture this generation. Let us pray for our youth, invest in them, and encourage them to be bold leaders for Christ. If we do this, the church will not only survive but thrive- and North America will once again see the light of Christ shining through a new generation.




